

## **Perspective - Reviewing Guidelines**

### **REVIEWER CRITERIA CHECKLIST/ COMMENTS TO AUTHORS**

#### **General**

When writing your review, use line number(s) to identify where the comment refers. This checklist is for your guidance only and should not be uploaded into the review you submit. Cutting and pasting sections, accompanied with appropriate page line numbers, is acceptable.

- Fills a clearly defined gap in the literature.
- Is within the scope of JNEB.
- Would be of interest to JNEB readership.
- Professional scientific language is used.

#### **Title**

- Is a concise, accurate description of the article.
- It is not necessary to include type of study.

#### **Keywords**

- Includes appropriate MeSH keywords.

#### **Abstract**

- Format and length correspond with Guidelines for Perspectives.

#### **Introduction**

- Summarizes existing literature relevant to the issue addressed.
- Describes the theoretical foundation or conceptual framework for the study.
- Explains why the research is important.
- Describes the program evaluated (if applicable).
- States the purpose/objectives and hypotheses.
- Clearly states the Perspective being addressed.

#### **Alternative Headings to Methods and Results**

- Viewpoint, premise, or agreement beyond what is presented in the Introduction.

#### **Discussion**

- Reflection on concept, program, model, or topic about which authors have a viewpoint.
- All mentions of *future work* should be in the IMPLICATIONS section.

### **Implications for Research, Practice and Policy**

Specifies how researchers, practitioners, and policymakers could apply this perspective to future work.

### **References**

Are up to date.

Supports opinions reflected by authors.

Are readily available to readers.

Are the vast majority formatted according to *JNEB* Guidelines? If they are not in *JNEB* Style, do not take the time to correct them, simply alert the authors to correct them.

### **Tables and Figures**

Should have appropriately descriptive titles that help them stand alone.

Are these adequately footnoted so they can be interpreted without reference to text?
